ABOUT THE HATCHLING

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A beautiful dragon hatches, builds herself a nest and then takes to the skies in a bid for her freedom. Along the way, she explores the city, and as she roams, she encounters a series of events from intimate interactions to city-wide performances, prepared especially for her majestic visit.

At the end of her journey our Hatchling undergoes an incredible metamorphosis, unfurls her wings, and takes flight! With a wingspan of over 20 meters, the Hatchling is the world's largest human-operated puppet to fly.

JOB DESCRIPTION

ROLE SUMMARY

The successful candidate will work within stage management and running teams to provide effective stage management of the show and performers, contributing to show reports, and reporting and reacting within the show environment to ensure running and safety mechanisms are smooth and regular. They should possess outstanding organisational skills, with the ability to maintain a calm and positive attitude in the busy working environment of a large-scale international production.

The Assistant Stage Managers will form part of the communications hub for the daily running of the show. They will gather notes and feed into systems designed alongside the Stage and Deputy Stage Manager. The ideal candidates will have experience and knowledge of the working practices of a large scale outdoor shows.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Support and manage the Puppeteers and Kiters during rehearsals and production in Wakefield providing pastorl care where necessary.
- Support the Senior Stage Manager during tech, calling the tech as required
- Ensure that all set and props are kept in a tidy, clean and orderly manner;
- Act as a credible ambassador for Trigger at all times;
- Ensure that reasonable care is taken to ensure a healthy and safe working environment for the production;







- THE HATCHLING
- Create and maintain setting lists and running lists, and keep accurate records of the production;
- Along with the Stage Manager, maintain the artistic direction of the production as per the direction of the creative team, whilst adhering to Health and Safety regulations as laid out by the Production Manager;
- Along with Stage Manager stage manage any press/publicity calls as required;
- Take and distribute the minutes for production meetings.
- Undertake any other appropriate duties which Trigger or the Stage Manager may allocate;
- Support the puppeteers in crowd control/walk around performance specific
- Puppeteer rotation

Qualifications and Skills:

- Experience in assistant stage management for outdoor events or similar productions.
- Strong organizational and multitasking abilities.
- Excellent communication and teamwork skills.
