We are seeking Costume Assistants based in Wakefield to join The Hatchling team for our 2024 presentation. An exciting opportunity to learn from a team of award-winning creatives and be part of a magic show. The ideal candidate will be enthusiastic about costume design and may have some experience in the theatre specifically. You'll be assisting the Costume Maker & Supervisor, supporting the adaptation and modification of existing costumes, assisting in the management of costume preparations, and aiding in fittings as needed.

# **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Using the original costume designs for The Hatchling, assist the costumer supervisors in adapting and amending
  the existing costumes for a new local cast of puppeteers (30) and kiters (14) for The Hatchling presentation in
  the city of Wakefield.
- Assist the costume supervisor in conducting fittings and take measurements where required.
- Assist the costume supervisor to amend and deliver high quality costumes as per the original designs on time and within budget.
- Ensure costumes are packed, cleaned and stored appropriately for storage.
- Exercise all reasonable skill, care and diligence in undertaking and carrying out the project.
- Comply with the highest standards of health and safety while making and liaise with the Costume Supervisor to ensure that the materials used are appropriate and safe.
- Attend costume meetings as necessary as required.
- Be on first call to The Hatchling during costume making period (rehearsals) and the live event.
